



### 2. Cozy Up

It's difficult to go anywhere in the Hocking Hills region and not feel romantic. The southeastern Ohio area famous for its impressive fall foliage is just as stunning in winter, when ice encases the moss and ground, preserving it all until spring.

Take your sweetheart by the hand and enjoy a day of hiking along the endless trails in the Hocking State Forest. In the adjacent Hocking Hills State Park, the Sweetheart Hike to

Ash Cave on Feb. 11 is an annual favorite. Often, a frozen waterfall at the base of the cave sets a magnificent scene.

After a day of activity, head to a cozy cabin-the region has numerous quaint lodging options, some of which include luxury perks such as couples' massages and hot tubs. And

some partner with South Bloomingville's Grouse Nest Restaurant, which can send its traveling chef to prepare a Valentine's feast.

"It is very romantic," said Chef Stacy Miller. "If you want to wow your significant other, that is the way to go."

The executive menu includes a dozen red roses, a bottle of champagne or wine, and a sumptuous multicourse meal. Grouse Nest can also schedule massages.

### 3. Outdoor Adventure

A forest hike is just one outdoor option—there are plenty more wintry adventures at Ohio's 74 state parks. All offer seasonal events in addition to everyday opportunities. Plan a full day or weekend with a combination of activities.

Secure some sleds and hit the hills at one of 42 state parks with designated sledding areas. Rent or bring your own ski equipment to explore park shorelines and picnic areas that have been transformed into crosscountry trails. Lace up skates and glide onto ice-skating rinks. If you're looking for something low-key, pack a basket with binoculars and a thermos of hot chocolate for a little romantic bird spotting. Short-eared owls, grosbeaks and golden eagles stay for the season.

### 4. Toast and Taste

Ohio wineries raise a glass to Valentine's couples with Chocolate is for Lovers, a tasting event along the Vines and Wines Trail near Lake Erie. Because winter crowds are smaller. wineries can give more personal attention to visitors.

"Fifteen wineries open their doors and provide great conversation and tasty appetizers matched with lovely Ohio wines," said Donniella Winchell, executive director of the Ohio Wine Producers Association.

You'll receive a crystal wine glass and a candy dish to fill with handmade chocolates available at each stop. Chocolate is for Lovers is scheduled this year Feb. 3-4 and Feb. 10-11.

### 5. Singles' Mingle

If you don't have a Valentine, don't despair—Snow Trails in Mansfield is catering to the single crowd. Feb. 14 will feature half-price unlimited tubing and, at the main lodge, food and drink specials and entertainment. With a rush of adrenaline and a little mingling, who knows—you may even make a love connection.

### 6. Sweet Smorgasbord

Life is short; eat dessert first in Wooster when the entire downtown becomes a chocolate paradise during the annual Chocolate Daze, scheduled this year Feb. 10-11.

Take a stroll down Main Street. where several dozen businesses will tempt with mocha martinis, chocolate fondue, chocolate barbecue and, for something different, chocolate manicures and chocolate diamonds. The decadent feast is free.

"This event has become a signature event for downtown Wooster," said Sandra Hull, executive director of Main Street Wooster Inc. "Lots of people, lots of chocolate and lots of enjoyment for everyone, participants and businesses alike."

Couples can get in on food affairs themselves by signing up for a cooking class at Today's Kitchen Store, also in Wooster. Among its ongoing series of classes is a Romantic Dinner with Rick Davis, scheduled Feb. 11.


### 7. Love Train

In Nelsonville, climb aboard the Hocking Valley Scenic Railway's Valentine Chocolate Choo-Choo for a romantic evening that includes heavy hors d'oeuvres, wine and lots of chocolate within the ambience of a restored antique train car.

The Chocolate Choo Choo departs after a social hour on Feb. 11. The one-and-a-half-hour ride on the rails includes live onboard entertainment.

Love is a little twisted at the Edgar Allan Poe Live Performance Theater in Canal Fulton. At its Valentine's Day event on Feb. 11, ladies receive a black rose instead of a red one—along with an attached finger or other body part as a token of love.

shack on frozen Lake Erie for some ice fishing. Capt. Bud Gehring sets up and preheats shanties on the ice while he waits for your arrival by airplane or airboat to Put-in-Bay Island.

"By the time [visitors] get there, the shanties are heated, the rods are in there and it's ready to go," said Gehring, who's chartered for 28 years.

A four-wheeler delivers you to a camp on a floating fortress of ice that's monitored hourly for safety. Even if the fish aren't biting, the moment is prime for snuggling.
